Children's and Young Adult Librarian's Report for 2/24/25 for CFL/BOT Meeting

- Tales and Tails will now be on the first Saturday of the month starting immediately. We found it was becoming difficult to rely on the Caring Canine folks to be here every Saturday because...life! I felt we were less likely to disappoint our patrons with last minute cancellations and I had an assurance that the first Saturday of the month would work for the dogs and their handlers. Despite the dogs not coming to the children's room we have had very busy Saturdays with an average of 12-14 patrons typically staying for 1.5-2 hours.
- We had a large crowd (Approximately 59) at the Puppetkabob performance of The Snowflake Man on Friday, January 31st. Everyone was enthralled, from the usual Storytime PreK kids, the 4th graders (they LOVED it) and every adult I spoke to. We may have to make this an annual event. Sarah Frechette, the puppeteer, was a delight to work with. Please take a moment to read the thank you notes from Kim Lucci and Randi Ray's 4th grade class, they are wonderful!
- We had 6 kids and adults stop in for the Drop- in Valentine's Day custom card craft on February 5th. I have decided to have a monthly craft event, our patrons seem to enjoy being able to stop in and not have to reserve a spot.
- I had a wonderful time with the Kids Cooking Club during February vacation. We had classes on 2/18, 2/19, 2/20 from 2-4. The first class was breakfast, (omelets, pumpkin bread, homemade butter lunch on day 2 (homemade soup, grilled cheese, cookies), and dinner on day 3 (homemade tomato sauce, meatballs, with pasta and a salad with homemade vinaigrette and a dessert). They also learned safe knife skills, measuring dry and liquid ingredients, following recipes, and common cooking terms. We had 6 children each of the days (the class size was limited to 6). Many thanks to volunteers Jacque Frost and Ann Pierce for their invaluable help with the cooking classes.
- We had an extremely busy week during school vacation- almost constant crowds of kids, parents, and grandparents. There were 20 people (adults & kids) on the Friday, of vacation, for storytime and a craft and they stayed an average of 2.5 hours.

- To keep families excited and informed about our titles, I constantly rotate the books displayed on the picture book, junior fiction, graphic novel, non-fiction, and young adult shelves as well as doing separate themed displays. This month's special displays were for: Black History Month, Valentine's Day, Hide and Seek books, classic books, and new titles.
- I am very excited about the Siber Sled Dogs Event on March 8th from 10-11 am. Highly recommended by other libraries in Vermont, musher Milagro Turner will bring her Huskies and sled for a talk, photos ops, dog hugging and maybe a reading of one of her books.
- Still working on what the Take and Make & Drop in craft will be for March.
